The final (external) component of the Caribbean Primary Exit Assessment (CPEA) is scheduled for Thursday 17 and Friday 18 May 2018. 2,026 students are registered for the assessment from 70 schools. These include 1,081 males and 945 females. In 2017, 1,917 students were registered; 1,039 were males and 878 were females.

(Jamaica) Primary Exit Profile (PEP) is Jamaica's national high school entrance test. It is a series of assessments taken in Grades 4, 5 and 6 and replaces the Grade Six Achievement Test (GSAT). There are 4 subjects, namely, Language Arts, Social Studies, Science and Mathematics.

Results have shown that the majority of the 336 local Grade 6 students who sat the Caribbean Primary Exit Assessment (CPEA) have passed their exams.
