The Great Siege of Gibraltar was an unsuccessful attempt by Spain and France to capture Gibraltar from the British during the American Revolutionary War. The British garrison under George Augustus Eliott were blockaded from June 1779 to February 1783, initially by the Spanish alone, led by Martín Álvarez de Sotomayor.

Immediately following the declaration of war between Spain and Great Britain on June 16, 1779, a combined Spanish-French fleet under Luis de Cordova y Cordova immediately formed a blockade of the Gulf of Cadiz, intending to starve out the British garrison at Gibraltar and prevent reinforcement.
