Typically, the model of teaching has four phases: I DO- where the teacher models the lesson objective in a focus lesson, WE DO- guided instruction with both input from the teacher and the students, YOU DO TOGETHER: Collaborative learning in small groups or partners and YOU DO ALONE- independent ...

The model is sequenced into the following four steps: 1. I Do - the teacher leads instruction 2. We Do - the teacher leads guided practice 3. You Do Together - students practice collaboratively 4. You Do - students practice independently

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The gradual release of

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responsibility (also known as I do, we do, you do) is a teaching strategy that includes demonstration, prompt, and practice. At the beginning of a lesson or when new material is being introduced, the teacher has a prominent role in the delivery of the content. This is the “I do” phase.

STRATEGIES**

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In brief, the gradual release of responsibility model is that in which over the progression of the lesson, the teacher becomes less and less involved and the student takes more and more ownership over the content. I think this can be incredibly powerful in a math classroom and even more specifically when working with struggling students.

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The Gradual Release of Responsibility Model - Maneuvering

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Each gradual release model lesson plan concludes with Independent Practice to measure understanding. Students work on their own to read a passage and answer a variety of item types, including one- and two-part multiple choice, short

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response, extended response, and/or essay.

Steps in the gradual release of responsibility A teacher that uses the gradual release of responsibility will still have a primary role at the beginning of a lesson or when new material is being

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introduced. The teacher should begin, as with all lessons, by establishing the goals and purpose of the day's lesson.
